Diakonos

- By definition he/she is a servant or minister
- Whose servant is he or to whom does he minister
- See Acts 6:3
- By accepting the office, he serves three:
 - A servant of God
 - Commissioned (hired) by the Pastor
 - Selected (called) by the People

Servant of God

- EVERY Christian's duty
- A deacon is a shining example of a life that
 - Seeks the good of all mankind
 - See Rom13:8; 2 Co 12:14; Gal. 2:17,
 - Seeks Christ diligently
 - See Col 3:1; Heb. 11:6,14; 13:14
 - Genesis to Revelation applies

Servant of the Pastor

- God did not appoint Deacons, the Apostles did
 - To what are deacons ordained at your church?
 - Ordained by definition is “put in order”
 - Know how “this business” is defined before you accept
 - Realize the next pastor has the authority to redefine “this business”
 - Understand tradition(not scripture) defines tenure

Servant of the People

- The people CHOSE from *among* themselves
- The people looked for those who could handle “*this business*”
- The people *elevated* the seven for ordination
- With the permission of God and the Pastor, *do WHATEVER they need of you*, even if it not traditional

What We SHOULD Do

- Quench fires instead of starting them
 - Do more than required
 - Be a peace maker
 - Stay in your lane
- Help your membership grow spiritually
 - Be deacon, not ace
 - Understand spiritual gifts and how to develop
 - Lead others to learn the bible

What We Should NOT Do

- Fight the pastor.
 - It is better to speak the truth in love, vote, let it go
- Everything the membership asks.
 - Vett through your deacons, pastor, and God if any doubt
- Come out (to serve) from among the people
 - Stay at work as you were before the people chose you

Rev. Thomas Elliott Huntley, D.D.

Birth: Jun. 25, 1903

Death: Sep. 27, 1983

A graduate of Morehouse College & Virginia Union Theological Seminary, Huntley became pastor of Central Baptist Church in St. Louis, Missouri in 1942. Pastor Huntley led the first national Negro Ministers Prayer march on Washington, D.C. in 1948, which sparked the proclamation for the first Civil Rights Bill by President Truman. His church hosted Dr. Martin Luther King's first sermon in St. Louis in 1961. He published the first edition of **Huntley's Manual for Every Baptist** in 1963.
